WHP ROAD CLOSURES

Our Roads haven't been in a good state of repair for a very long time but during December/ January they dropped to an all time low. This was exacerbated by the huge number of major road works and flooding.

Four roads were totally closed at the same time (Forest Road still is and will be until 3rd week of February) and combined with other road works it made travel extremely difficult. Potholes seem to have multiplied and can be most dangerous and expensive particularly when full of water and they can't be seen.

There is no doubt that our road surfaces have deteriorated greatly through the increase in traffic volumes. This will only get worse with planned development that still might come. One particular cause is the 38 ton HGVs that thunder up and down our narrow roads, not only ruining the surfaces but also the verges. Even pavements and curbs have suffered very badly.

Just before the Road Works/Flooding problems the WH Parish Council had spoken with SCC with a view to initiating a review of our roads, signs, speeds, potholes, verges etc. We are now starting that review and when SCC reps come to the villages, hopefully sometime in March, we can draw up plans of action. We shall also be able to check on progress of certain problem areas that were registered last summer.
